More Americans Look Forward to Traveling

With the COVID pandemic transitioning to an endemic phase and the unemployment rate dropping to a pre-pandemic low, more Americans are planning summer vacation travel this year.

Just two in 10 Americans plan to stay home this summer, half as many of those who stayed home last summer (four in 10) and only one-third the number who stayed home during the first summer of the pandemic.

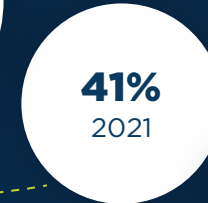
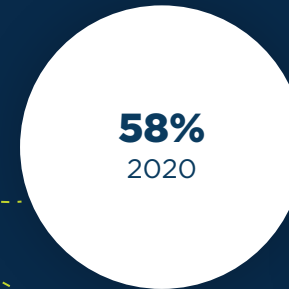
More than 60% of Americans are planning at least one summer trip between mid-May and mid-September — and half of those plan more than one. Another 14% have not decided if they will travel this summer.

Twice as many Americans expect to drive to their vacation spots as those who plan to fly; about one in 20 haven't decided how they'll travel.

Americans who did not travel for summer vacation

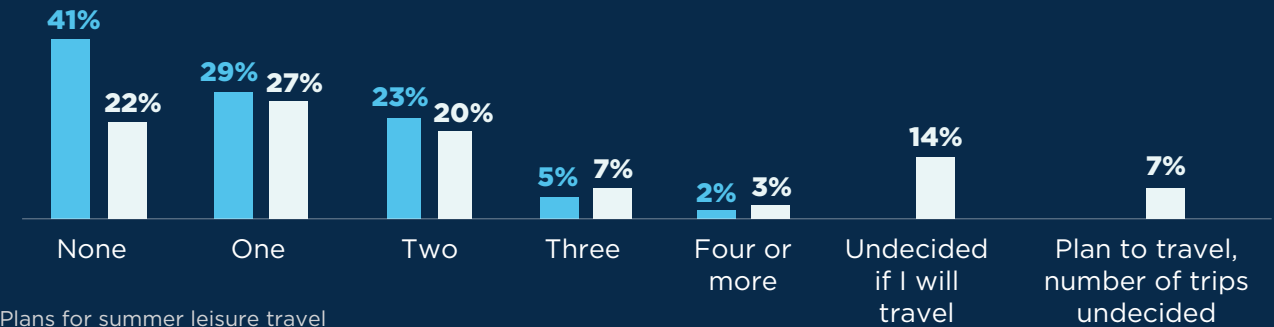
